The main performance venues in the Performing Arts Center include the **Jensen Grand Concert Hall, Bistline Theatre, Rogers Theatre**, and **Marshall Rotunda**. A number of nonperformance areas in the Stephens Performing Arts Center are named for donors who gave generously to support the center's construction. Others are named for theatre and film professionals.

Patrons enter the center on the **Dr. William L. and Doris Weaver Brydon Mezzanine** of the Marshall Rotunda. The Jensen Grand Concert Hall is reached via the **Michael C. and Maureen L. Ruettgers Promenade** and the **Arlo D. and Jackie Luke Promenade**. To reach the Bistline Theatre, patrons follow the **Samuel Horne Bennion Promenade**. The **David A. Thomas Set Design Shop** provides

Theatre/Dance ISU with advanced tools for creating scenes and props, while the **Kathryn Grayson Costume Design Studio** accommodates artistic expression in that component of live performance.

The **John C. Foreman Green Room** provides a quiet place where performers can await their moment in the spotlight. The J.R. Simplot Company Conference Room provides meeting space that augments

Theatre/Dance ISU's classrooms and offices.

Joseph C. and Cheryl H. Jensen Grand Concert Hall



The Stephens Center's largest venue reflects the commitment of donors, designers and Idaho State University to providing the finest listening experience available today. The grand concert hall will seat up to 1,200. It incorporates state-of-the-art acoustical technology to optimize sound and theatre experiences for audiences in a wide range of performances.

It is the only true concert hall in the region with computer-adjustable tuning panels and sound curtains. More than 500 fiberglass-reinforced gypsum side panels weigh up to 2,000 pounds each, although two panels weigh some 36,000 pounds each. The hall includes two computer-controlled ceiling canopies, each about 20,000 pounds, that can move to adjust the hall's acoustics. That system is paired with six 17,000-pound, one-story-high movable acoustic side panels that can be adjusted with computerized controls.

The result: The Jensen Grand Concert Hall can be tuned to meet the acoustical needs of any performance. While electronic amplification is available, the design allows sound to resonate naturally through the hall.

Beverly B. Bistline Thrust Theatre



The Beverly B. Bistline Theatre's "thrust" stage extends out, allowing up to 450 audience members to sit around it in an arc. That enables the audience to see all aspects of a performance. Generally, electronic amplification of actors' voices is necessary in thrust theatres. While the Bistline Theatre offers the option of electronic amplification, the need should be rare due the theatre's sound-reflecting panels in the rear walls and ceiling. The theatre also features removable flanking side walls that allow the backstage area to be architecturally masked, or to be coupled to the stage as performance space. The stage floor is constructed in removable sections as well.

James E. and Beverly Rogers Black Box Theatre




Artistic flexibility is the hallmark of this versatile venue, which is designed to accommodate new and experimental works. It is essentially a large, rectangular black room. It is equipped with a complex overhead lighting grid, as well as movable seating. The latter permits flexibility in the shape and size of the performance space. The theatre is named for philanthropists who have been especially generous in their support of Idaho State University and higher education.

Barbara J. Marshall Rotunda



With its soaring domed ceiling, the inspiring Barbara J. Marshall Rotunda is the centerpiece of the Stephens Performing Arts Center. While its primary function is akin to a foyer for the center, it is in fact a versatile space that accommodates many uses. It has been the venue for such important events as the announcement of the appointment of Dr. Arthur C. Vailas as Idaho State University's new president, and performances of productions like "Antigone," both in 2006.
